Missouri Chapter of the American Fisheries Society Student Achievement Award

The Missouri Chapter of the American Fisheries Society Student Support Trust Fund was established to assist deserving students with financial aid for their professional development in the aquatic natural resources field. Funding for this award comes from interest earned on the Student Support Trust Fund core funds. The Student Achievement Award recognizes excellence in academic achievement and extra-curricular involvement by Missouri students. A selection committee consisting of MOAFS members ranks applicants and selects the recipient. Once selected, the award recipient is notified and presented a check in the amount of \$500.00 at the MOAFS annual business meeting. Award monies must be used for education related expenses including tuition, books, fees, or travel to aquatic society related conferences or meetings.

Eligibility

Applicants must be enrolled as an undergraduate or graduate student at a Missouri college or university during the semester when the scholarship application is due (fall semester) and pursuing a degree in the aquatics natural resource field (ex: natural resources management, fisheries science, biology, wildlife conservation, environmental science, or a related field). Applications and supporting materials must be submitted by December 1. Procedures and application are on the reverse side. *The scoring rubric accounts for competitive differences between undergraduate and graduate students to ensure applicants are competitive, regardless of academic status.
